REPORT

The Governors beg to submit herewith their Report for the Session 1895-96.

It is a gratifying circumstance that the attendance at the Schools showed a marked increase over that of any year since their establishment in 1886.

There were 739 individual pupils attending the Classes, against 615 of last Session. The total number of attendances made by the pupils during the Session was 24,656, giving an average attendance of 150 per night.

From the above it will be seen that there is a slight decrease this Session in the successes of the Science and Art Classes in four subjects. This is chiefly due to alterations in the examinations, the standard in many cases having been raised. The results, however, compare favourably with those obtained by other kindred institutions. One of our pupils, Andrew Steedman, whose answering was of a distinguished character, was awarded a "Teacher's Training Course" at South Kensington.

In the Technological subjects, in which Examinations were held by the City and Guilds of London Institute, an increase has been reported in the number of successful pupils from these Schools.

For detailed list of successful pupils at the examinations, see Appendix A.

The Classes in English and Electric Lighting and Transmission of Power, which were opened this Session, were well attended, and now fairly complete the Commercial and Electrical Departments of the School.

The Classes which showed the greatest increase in numbers were:— Building Construction, Carpentry, Plumbing, Writing and Cookery.

Owing to the increasing demand for admission to certain Classes, the Governors have decided to build extra Class-rooms, the plans for which have been prepared by the City Architect, and they will proceed with the building as soon as possible. The matter is one of extreme urgency, as the Schools show every sign of still further growth.

During the Session the Schools were visited by the Inspector from the Department of Science and Art, and the following notice of his Report was received:—

“The attendance has improved to a daily average of about 140 at present, and the Teaching staff is very satisfactory and efficient. There is a spirit of improvement about the Institution, and, I think, good work is being done in it.”

The fees received during the Session in the Science and Art Classes amounted to £103 12s. 6d., and in the Technological and Commercial Classes to £193 6s., making a total of £296 18s. 6d. The Governors claim from the Science and Art Department £74, upon the successes obtained at the May examinations in Science and Art. A grant in aid, amounting to £930 17s. 1d., has been paid to the Governors by the Department of Science and Art under Minutes of 17th January, 1893, and 1st May, 1894, of the Department for the teaching of Commercial and Technological subjects.

A Balance Sheet of the Technological and Commercial Classes will be found appended. See Appendix D.

A Balance Sheet, showing receipts and expenditure of the Science and Art Classes, will be published in the Corporation accounts.

Private subscriptions received during the year amounted to £89 4s.

The Governors desire to return thanks to the Right Hon. the Lord Mayor, Messrs. Maguire and Son, Messrs. Thomas Dockrell and Son, Messrs. The Governors elected by the subscribers retire in accordance with the regulations, and offer themselves for re-election.
