T H E G O V E R N O R S
OF THE
CITY OF DUBLIN TECHNICAL SCHOOLS,
FOR THE SESSION, 1899-1900.

The Governors beg to present herewith their Fourteenth Annual Report.

The Schools opened on Monday evening, 25th September, 1899, and classes were held in 34 subjects. During the Session, 998 pupils were enrolled, as against 1,076 in the previous Session. The slight decrease in number this year was due to the fact that we were compelled, for want of room, to refuse admission to many of our classes, owing to the rebuilding of the Schools.

The total number of class entries was 1,394, and the attendance throughout the Session was good. For comparison we give the average nightly attendance for the last two years for the months of November and February—the second months of the first and second terms respectively, by which time the classes have settled down to regular, steady work. Average nightly attendance during November, 1899, 277, as compared with 285 in November, 1898, and 222 in February, 1900, against 225 in February, 1899. It is satisfactory to note that these figures show that the falling off after

Christmas was not quite so marked this year as heretofore. In Appendix A we give the number of entries in the various subjects for the last two years.

During the Session the Schools were visited by the Inspector of the Science and Art Department, and the following notice of his report was received:—

I am directed to transmit, for the information of the Managers, the following extract from the report of the Inspector of this Department, who recently visited the above-named school:—

“The classes are in general very well attended, and the students earnest. The instruction good, and the lectures on Experimental Science well illustrated by suitable experiments. Some more apparatus is required for illustration of the subjects of Applied Mechanics and Steam. The class rooms are small, and a good lecture room is much to be desired. The chemical lecture room is quite unsuitable, but I understand a new one is being provided.”

The Governors were long since convinced of the necessity of providing the accommodation, &c., referred to in the Inspector's report, and had plans prepared for additions and alterations to the School Buildings.

The new buildings commenced in August, 1900, are now almost finished, and will contain two suitable

lecture theatres, one being specially devoted to chemistry, several class rooms, laboratories and workshops. This will enable us to give much more practical and systematic courses of instruction than heretofore, and to open a class in Hygiene for Sanitary Inspectors and others, as recommended by the Public Health Committee. In order that the equipment of the Schools should be as complete as possible, we referred the furnishing of the Schools to a sub-committee, and appointed a deputation, consisting of Councillor Dr. Kennedy, Chairman; Mr. John Good, Hon. Sec., Master Builders' Association; Mr. George Leahy, President, Dublin Trades' Council; Professor G. F. Fitzgerald, Mr. Arnold Graves, and our Secretary, to visit schools in England, and to report thereon.

We regret that neither Professor Fitzgerald nor Mr. Graves were able to accompany the deputation. This deputation has not yet furnished their report.

The fees received during the Session for Science and Art instruction amounted to £118 18s. 9d., and for Technological and Commercial instruction to £203 9s., making a total of £322 7s. 9d. A grant of £190 12s. 9d. was paid to the Schools by the Board of Education for Science and Art instruction, and £500 for instruction in Technological and Commercial instruction given during the previous Session.

Private subscriptions and donations received during the year amounted to £64 7s. A statement showing the total income and expenditure of the Technological and Commercial classes will be found appended (see Appendix B); while a statement showing the receipts and expen-

diture of the Science and Art classes will be published in the Corporation accounts.

We desire to return thanks to Lady Thomson, Mrs. Frazer, Mr. J. R. Boyd, Mr. M. Crowley, Mr. A. Conan, Mr. A. Purser, Mr. R. Wharton, and the Dublin Guild of Master Painters, and the Master Builders' Association, for their kind assistance at the Examinations; and to the Right Hon. the Lord Mayor, Mr. R. Coulson, Messrs. Dockrell & Sons, Messrs. Kennan and Sons, Messrs Maguire & Gatchell, Messrs. Mansfield and Sons, Mr. J. F. Keatinge, Mr. John Long, Mr. John Mulligan, Mr. John Sibthorpe, the Dublin Guild of Master Painters, and the Master Builders' Association, for special prizes, and also to the other subscribers to the Schools.

In Appendix C will be found a list of the successful pupils at the May Examinations. In Appendix D a list of Life Members and Subscribers, and in Appendix E a return of attendances of the Governors from December, 1899, to present date.
