FÁILTE AN UACHTARÁIN

Tá áthas orm fáilte a fhearadh romhaibh inniu, lá deasghnátha agus ceiliúrtha. Táimid, céimithe, aionna agus baill fhoirne de chuid Dámh na hEolaíochta, cruinnithe in Ardeaglais mhaorga, stairiúil Phádraig ar ócáid bhliantiúil Shearmanas Bhronnta na nGradam.

Is lá iontach é seo daoibh siúd atá ar tí bhur gcéimnithe. Is ceiliúradh é ar fhíorghaisce a d'éirigh libh a bhaint amach trí thalann agus trí dhiansaothar, agus tréaslaím sibh go fial as marc tábhachtach a bhaint amach in bhur saolréanna. Molaim freisin bhur gclanna agus bhur gcairde as a mblianta siúd de dhiansaothar agus de dhúthracht. Inniu, is féidir libhse agus leosan bheith as cuimse bródúil as a bhfuil déanta agaibh.

Tréaslaím freisin mo choghleacaithe féin - bhur léachtóirí, bhur dteicneoirí, agus iad siúd a dhéanann riaradh agus cabhrú eile libh - as na torthaí ar a sárshaothar agus a ndúthracht, ar léiriú sibhse agus bhur ngaisce orthu sin.

Lá fíor-thábhachtach é lá bronnta na ngradam i saol na hInstitiúide de bhrí gur marc foirmiúil é ar aistriú nua-eolais agus scileanna chuig glún nua, agus mar sin, ar chur chun cinn na tíre agus a geileagair. Is bunúsach céimithe san Eolaíocht chun ár dtuiscint ar an saol a feabhsú agus chun ár mbeatha ann a fheabhsú. Bainfidh an-chuid de tionscail agus den tsochaí féin leas as bhur n-ábaltacht chun cur leis an tuiscint sin.

Mar chéimithe den DIT tá dóchas orainn go mbeidh sibh bródúil an t-am ar fad as an Institiúid seo, agus mar *alumnus* nó *alumna*, go gcoimeádfaidh sibh spéis in ngach forbairt anseo. Mar is eol daoibh, tá sé de cheangal ar an Institiúid an t-am ar fad an caighdeán is airde a bhaint amach trí caighdeáin acadúla ard-leibhéil a chinntiú agus deiseanna oideachais a chur ar fáil atá insroichte do dhaoine de gach aois sa phobal. Ag glacadh leis go dtagann daoine don bhfoghlaim ag céimeanna éagsúla i rith a saolta, tá ceangal orainn deiseanna staidéir a sholáthar san DIT go páirtaimseartha nó go lánaimseartha trí chúrsaí lá agus trí chúrsaí oíche.

Is í an DIT an chéad institiúid de leibhéal ollscoile in Éirinn a chuir próisis Chinntiú Caighdeán i gcrích maidir lena chuid chláracha uile. Is lárnach é seo chun caighdeáin agus gníomh den scoth a bhaint amach i ngach Scoil agus i ngach Roinn. Earcaítear baill fhoirne den chaighdeán is airde ina réimsí cuí, agus spreagtar iad chun a gcuid eolais a leathnú trí thaighde agus trí fhorbairt. Déanann sé seo ár gcaighdeáin acadúla a ráthú, ach freisin, cinntíonn ábharthacht ár gcláracha maidir le cúrsaí tráchtála, tionsclaíochta agus ealaíona.

Tá athruithe suntasacha taghtha ar an DIT ó thosaigh sibh ar bhur gcuid staidéar, ach tá ceangal orainn dul ar aghaidh an t-am ar fad chun freastal ar riachtanais an tsochaí, fiú is go bhfuil siad sin ag athrú i gcónaí. Deimhníodh le déanaí i gcinneadh an rialtais go dtosóimid ar champas nua don Institiúid a thógáil go luath i nGráinseach an Ghormánaigh. Deis gan réamhshampla is ea é seo chun timpeallacht fhoghlama agus mhúinte a fhorbairt chun freastal ar riachtanais na hInstitiúide, agus eiseamláir a chur ar fáil do lucht oideachais na hÉireann sa 21ú céad.

Tá an chéad chéim de bhur staidéir fhoirmiúla críochnaithe anois, ach tá súil againn go bhfanfaidh sibh i dteagmháil le bhur *alma mater* trí Chumann na gCéimithe, agus go mbuailfidh le chéile arís ag céimeanna eile i rith bhur saolréanna.
