The Twinbrook Social and Recreational Club was destroyed in a bombing attack in 1975. The Club had a varied and important programme catering for the young with music, football, table tennis etc; and for the old with film shows, functions, darts etc;

The Club survived on a voluntary basis and was the main focal point for workers to meet and socialise. The Twinbrook Estate has no other such Club and now, after three years, the TSRC Committee has received a site and a lease from the Northern Ireland Housing Executive to build premises. In this new building we hope to have, as well as a social Club, a Citizens Advice Bureau and other office accommodation.
