## Report from AGM, Pearse Cumann, Sinn Fein

At the AGM of the Pearse Cumann, Sinn Fein, held last night, Eric O'Broin, chairman, said that although 1974 ~~xxxxx~~ had been a year of political and economic crisis, it is <sup>qualifying</sup> ~~justifying~~ to report that increased progress of the cumann over the year.

"1974 was a year which saw the continuation of the Provisional Alliance anti-civilian bombing campaign and their Christmas truce. It saw the <sup>SA</sup> National Wage Agreements, redundancies, <sup>and</sup> 90,000 workers on the dole. We witnessed the blackmailing tactics by the hospital consultants who forced Mr. Brendan ~~Covish~~ to shelve his free hospitalisation plans, and Mr. Richie Ryan likewise submitted to the lobbying pressures of the industrialists, rancher/farmers, speculators and landlords when he passed the farcical "wealth tax." <sup>SD</sup>

"Despite the usurpation of the name Sinn Fein by the Provisional Alliance, the ~~g~~ <sup>g</sup>rowing strength of our cumann is seen by the political education ~~xxxxxx~~ and the deeper awareness of economic and political issues. Above all, we have strengthened our commitment to the building of a thirty-two county <sup>democratic</sup> socialist republic.
