Dyslexia is a specific learning disability

"Specific learning disability" is a term used to describe disorders in one or more of the processes involved in understanding and/or using writing, spelling or arithmetic. It affects approimately 8% of all children. They have difficulty changing oral words into written language and visa versa.

Nobody knows exactly how or why these difficulties with learning occur. They are thought to be due to differences in the way the brain works. A specific learning disability is not caused by a physical problem, a lack of inteligence and emotional disturbance, poor teaching and home or family problems.

Your will find that some people tend to hide dyslexia very well, as they are embarrassed and afraid to admit that they have learning disability. It's only a problem if you hide from its.


