Literature

- Festivals are a medium for producing and remembering social meaning and realizing community through shared play and celebration (Levenda 1977)
- Festivals can also reconstruct identities of places and regional identity
- In terms of the diaspora people are often attracted to a particular place in order to maintain social contacts and because of 'emotional ties' (Hughes and Allen, 2010)
