films specially mentioned, but those which have
a bearing on health and social welfare are
also included. In fact any film which
depicts the conditions under which other
people have to live should have the same
facilities extended to it; for, apart from
presenting a useful lesson in geography, such
films create a certain sympathy for other
people's difficulties.
