- (c) In order to show your knowledge of the material and the methods employed in the execution of your design in the actual material, you are required to describe the process

Make a design for execution in some material, for reproduction in some craft or industry or for pictorial illustration.

The design may be for execution in a craft carried on within the school or for a craft or industry carried on locally. A design of simple type will be expected, and the working drawing or drawings should be made in black and white or in colour.

In order to show your knowledge of the material and the methods employed in the execution of your design in the actual material you are required to state the scale, full size or otherwise, and to describe the process briefly.
