- . Brief outline of the research contribution, outlining the research paper structure and how it will contribute to develop new ways of thinking in the proposed area of study (Research idea outline limited to 300 to 500 words excluding reference list).
- . Final paper should not exceed 6,000 words (including references, tables, figures, etc.)
