CALL for Autumn 2023 Issue

This **CALL** is for **submissions** on the theme of:

From DIT buildings to the TU Dublin campus

The Faculties and Schools of the Dublin Institute of Technology were frequently referred to by the building or street where they were located, such as Bolton Street, The Linenhall, Cathal Brugha Street, Kevin Street, Aungier Street, Portland Row, Chatham Row, Rathmines, Mountjoy Square. Now that the TU Dublin campus sites in Aungier Street, Bolton Street, Grangegorman, Tallaght and Blanchardstown have been linked in many ways, it is timely to record the iconic buildings which have been an integral part of the higher and adult education physical landscape in Dublin city for almost a century and a half.

The Autumn 2023 Issue of *Level3* will focus on the history of well-known DIT buildings and their significance as architectural ‘personalities’ in their own right as well as their roles as sites of learning and research in multiple fields of professional practice and civic engagement.

Information for authors

Length of contributions

Level3 is an online journal, so we are flexible with regard to the length of scientific articles, reports and other items. The following guidelines should help authors:

Full scientific articles: 4,000 – 6,000 words including references and appendices.

Reports: up to 8,000 words, larger if approved by the editors.

Analytical think-pieces: 1,000 – 2,000 words.

Note: We welcome visual images, animations, weblinks etc.

Please submit items in Word without a track-changes setting.

Author names

Author names and approved affiliation should be included immediately following the title.

Please check that all authors agree to submitting the item to Level3.

Email addresses of authors are required **ONLY** for communication with editors.

Abstract - A short abstract should follow author names.

Languages – authors who do not use either Irish or English as a first language may submit items in their first language provided there is an accurate English translation with it. We copy-edit and format the Irish and English versions only.

Copyright - Copyright remains with authors.

‘Second’ publications – authors may submit relevant items which have been published previously provided they have appropriate permissions. Such items are identified in Level3 Issues.

Ethical responsibility

Authors are responsible for the accuracy of their own writings and for ensuring that they have all relevant permissions to submit writing generated with others. Authors are responsible for any consequences that arise from content inaccuracies or from inadequate acknowledgements. It is procedurally difficult to alter items after publication online.

Peer review

Articles may be peer reviewed if authors request it. Peer-reviewed articles are identified as such.

Copy-editing and **formatting** will be done by the **Level3** team.

Authors will normally receive a final version before publication and should normally confirm their approval of that version.
