# CALL for State Centenary Issue (1922-2022)

## This CALL is for a special issue to mark the centenary of the state

The basic idea is to prepare an Issue which offers a series of thematic narratives which give a succinct account of a significant topic between 1922 and 2022 which has either a direct or indirect connection with TU Dublin activities in the broadest sense.

Authors may propose a topic narrative from their own fields of academic practice, research, links with civic society or with the world of work and industry. Narratives may be integrated with analysis and commentary. Submissions should not exceed five-thousand (5,000) words of main text, excluding maps, figures, tables and/or images.

Exemplar titles could be as follows:

- i. Design of public libraries since 1922
- ii. Employment patterns in manufacturing industries since 1922
- iii. Rail transport policies and their impact since 1922
- iv. Extractive industries since 1922
- v. Participation patterns in higher education since the foundation of the state
- vi. Eating patterns and food fads over a century.

**DEADLINE for submissions: 31 August 2022**

Authors who would like to discuss a proposal should contact one of the following editors:

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### **Length of contributions**

For this Special Centenary Issue we suggest a word limit of 5,000 words.

Maps, tables, images, figures, videos, oral recordings etc are welcome in addition to the text limit.

**Please submit items in Word** without a track-changes setting.

### **Author names**

Author names and approved affiliations should be included immediately following the title.

Please check that all authors agree to submitting the item to Level3.

Email addresses of authors are required **ONLY** for communication with editors.

**Abstract** - A short abstract should follow author names.

**Languages** – Authors who do not use Irish or English as a first language may submit items in their first language provided there is an accurate English translation with it. We copy-edit and format the Irish and English versions only.

**Copyright** - Copyright remains with authors.

**‘Second’ publications** – Authors may submit relevant items which have been published previously provided they have appropriate permissions. Such items are identified in Level3 Issues.

### **Ethical responsibility**

Authors are responsible for the accuracy of their own writings and for ensuring that they have all relevant permissions to submit writing generated with others. Authors are responsible for any consequences that arise from content inaccuracies or from inadequate acknowledgements. It is procedurally difficult to alter items after publication online.

### **Peer review**

Articles may be peer reviewed if authors request it. Peer-reviewed articles are identified as such.

**Copy-editing** and **formatting** will be done by the **Level3** team.

Authors will normally receive a final version before publication and should normally confirm their approval of that version.
